ART MAKING IN CUBA: A VISUAL ARTS PROGRAM

DESCRIPTION

Experience the authentic and fascinating art and culture of Cuba with this special eight-day art making and research program that will allow for self-expression and an exchange of ideas among people interested in Cuban art and culture.

We will visit different art sites in Havana, the town of Regla, and the Viñales Valley. Through guided fieldtrips and free time for art making and study, participants, **WITH ALL LEVELS OF ABILITIES**, will be able to sketch, draw, paint, make videos, and take photographs and exchange ideas.

Our journey will start in Old Havana. Old Havana special characteristics have earned the territory the titles of National Monument since 1978; Cultural Heritage of the Nation (1979); World Heritage Site (1982); and Conservation Priority Zone (1993). The city hosts visitors arriving in Cuba each year from all over the world. Roughly estimated over one million visit fortresses, museums, plazas, palaces, galleries, restaurants and cafes. Havana's visitors become acquainted not only with its significant architectural master works of art nouveau, art deco, and eclectical styles, historical, and cultural treasures, but also with the area's residents, culture and their life style.

We will walk through narrow streets, visit four main plazas, the Ambos Mundos hotel where at the beginning of the 30's North American writer Ernest Hemingway stayed and wrote the first chapters of the novel "From Whom the Bells Toll". In addition, we will be part of a dynamic artistic community when visiting cultural centers, art galleries, and artist's workshops and the recently renovated National Museum of Fine Arts with an outstanding collection of Cuban and Universal art from the 17th century to the present.

Across from Havana Harbor, we will visit the old town of Regla, a center of Afro-Cuban religions. Here we will make art and visit the Iglesia de Nuestra Señora de Regla (Church of the Virgin of Regla) and the Municipal Museum devoted to religious syncretism emphasizing the worship of Yemayá, patron goddess of Havana's Harbor.

For the last part of the program we will travel and stay for two nights at Viñales Valley. This site, included in the List of World Heritage site by UNESCO, is located in the Sierra de los

Organos belonging to the Guaniguanico mountainous range group in Pinar del Rio province, the most western zone of the island.

Viñales has an exceptional landscape, which is characterized, among other things, by the merging of a spectacular natural beauty, the preservation of the environment, the harmonic action of people in the cultivation of minor crops, essentially tobacco. The traditional tobacco cultivation and production method in Cuba have won universal recognition for the its cigars as the one with the best quality worldwide. Viñales, Old Havana and Regla are ideal sites to be inspired and relaxed for art making.

Professor Marcos Carvajal, our group leader, will be available for consultations and ready to strike up a conversation concerning his Cuban homeland. In closing, we will have a group session to exchange ideas and experiences.

Our accommodation in Old Havana will be at the landmark Seville Hotel-famous as the setting for Graham Greene's Our Man in Havana. The Hotel fitted to American and European comfort was built in 1924 and has a newly touched-up façade straight out of 1,001 Arabian Nights. The hotel is surrounded by art galleries, Central Park, Grand National Theater, Amadeo Roldan Theater (the site of the Cuban National Ballet), the Capitol and is across the National Museum of Fine Arts, creating the magic atmosphere of its setting.

All levels and abilities are welcomed in photography, video, drawing and painting. **CubArtEdu** will tailor dates to accommodate specific groups like art associations and schools.

ART MAKING MEDIA

It is recommended that all art material should be easy to carry and you should plan to buy your favorite brand at home (it may not be available in the country of our destination).

Drawing: Pencils, drawing pads, crayons, pastels, eraser, etc. or your own materials according to your own abilities and style of drawing. Easy to carry bag.

Painting: We suggest acrylic paint, nylon and bristle brushes of all kind of size and width, paper pad 100% rag, towel to clean brushes, portable water container, acrylic mediums, or your own materials according to your own abilities and style of painting and easy to carry bag. If you decide to work with oil painting, think of the slow process of drying.

Video: Video Camera, blank videocassettes, lightweight easel, and comfortable bag for camera, cassettes, and journal. (Do not plan to buy your favorite videocassette in the country of our destination).

Photography: Photography camera, film, lightweight easel, and comfortable bag for camera, film and journal. (Do not plan to buy your favorite film in the country of our destination). There are some commercial facilities in Cuba that can process film for you in prints in 1 hour but not in CD.

CUDARTED will provide information to participants about "calls for artists" opportunities to present artwork created in the Art Making in Cuba Program. In addition, our **ART MAKING IN CUBA GALLERY** is an exhibition featuring artworks by participants. Participants are encouraged to submit work of art and a one-paragraph description of the work. We also encourage the exhibit and publishing of art work and research findings through grassroots community activities, art associations, schools and exhibitions.

HOTELS

We will stay at Hotel Sevilla in Havana and La Ermita Hotel in Viñales

HOTEL SEVILLA

The Hotel Sevilla is a masterpiece of architecture, luxurious and familiar, which welcomes its visitors in the best tradition of Havana hospitality.

When it opened its doors on March 22, 1908, it became Havana's leading turn-of-the-century luxury hotel. From the elaborate façade to the lovely Patio Sevillano (Sevillian Yard), it recreates an authentically Spanish atmosphere, whose architectural and decorative elements show a market Mudéjar (Spanish Arab) influence.

The guestrooms and spacious lounges of the Sevilla retain their original charm and splendor. Among its most luxurious areas are the lobby and the unique Roof Garden restaurant, located on the top floor, which combines exquisite luxury and excellent service and cuisine, with exceptional views of Old and Modern Havana.

Traditional and classic, the Hotel Sevilla enjoys a privileged location next to Havana's beautiful Paseo del Prado. Just a few steps away from the Museum of Fine Arts and the architectural treasures of Old Havana.

LA ERMITA HOTEL

A beautiful country building, in complete harmony with the Viñales Valley Landscape, provides a peculiar panoramic view. The valley fills visitors with tranquility; your eyes get lost in its green landscapes and blue sky. This facility is a paradise for nature lovers. Air-conditioned rooms with private bath, telephone and radio. Restaurant, bar, swimming pool with snack bar, Medical Services, shop, Money Exchange, safety box, tennis court and information bureaus.

SAFETY

Cuba is actually extremely safe. Nevertheless, we recommend that you do not wear valuable jewelry or other expensive items, that you carry cash in a money—belt or close to your body, and take other normal precautions (e.g., don't walk alone at night in a neighborhood you are not familiar with, etc.). Please check with Program Leaders. Hotels provide safe deposit boxes in the rooms Safe your passport, money and other valuables in the box. Make 3 copies of your passport: leave one in the USA, carry one always and give a copy to your Program Leader.

LANGUAGE

You'll meet many Cubans who speak, or are studying, English. Of course speaking Spanish is an advantage in terms of getting into in-depth conversations with most of the people you'll meet. Your Program Leader is Cuban and bilingual and will be of great help when needed!

Translation services are available for hourly or daily rates.

VISITORS

Cubans assume that if you're visiting Cuba, you're there out of sympathy and curiosity, and most Cubans will be eager to talk to you about everything under the sun.

POLITICS

No matter what opinions you have before going you will meet Cubans who will challenge them and whom you will disagree with. It's fine to debate and argue. Just two cautions: one, if the person you're talking to seems uncomfortable or wants to change the subject, be sensitive to that; two, remember that no matter how much you've studied, the Cubans you'll meet are the ones who have lived the situation, and their opinions and experiences deserve to be listened to respectfully, no matter how much you may agree or disagree. For your own security do not engage in business transactions with people in the street.
